



Asian bush honeysuckles
(including Amur, Morrow's, Tatarian,
and Bell's honeysuckle)

(*Lonicera maackii*, *L. morrowii*,
L. tatarica, and *L. x bella*)

- Dense, multi-stemmed shrubs, 6-12' tall
- Leaves opposite, oval or oblong, and entire. This specimen is Amur honeysuckle, which is distinguished by leaves with long acuminate tips
- Flowers fragrant, tubular, and arranged in pairs at leaf axils; reddish pink or white, turning yellow with age
- Fruits red, orange, or yellow, in pairs at axils
- Invades forests, wetlands, and open areas throughout Monroe County
